World class healthcare comes to North County

This is part III of a series on the impact of the Carlsbad Chamber of Commerce over its 100 years of service to the Carlsbad community.

In the 1950s, the north coastal region of San Diego County was rural and had few services of its own. Local commu-

nity leaders knew that a modern local hospital was essential to the area's growth. Chamber leaders from the Carlsbad Chamber joined forces with the Oceanside and Vista Chambers to promote the idea



of creating a regional hospital.

In the mid 1950's, voters elected to form the **Tri-City** Hospital District. The voters also approved a bond issue to fund land purchases and construction costs. In 1961, the hospital opened its doors with 42 physicians on staff. Amid the excitement centered on Tri-City's grand opening was a recognition that North County's population was growing rapidly. Almost immediately, the need to expand services was evident.

Through the 1970s there was continual expansion of services, with additions of a helipad, cardiopulmonary lab, a 56bed north wing, more surgical suites and a 42-bed maternity unit. The 1980's brought more building, with a four-story wing added and existing facilities remodeled. New services were added, too, including cardiac rehabilitation, a mental health unit and a dialysis center.





4 ways going green can also help the bottom line

That's because it turns out that going green is a smart way to save green for your company. In fact, sustainability can reduce costs and improve operating profits by up to 60%, according to McKinsey & Company.

Sustainability

also matters more than ever to consumers. New data shows that 64% of Americans say protecting the environment should be a top priority. That's on par with strengthening the economy, which 67% of Americans say is important. This is based on findings from the Pew Research Center—which points out this is the first time sustainability has been ranked so high by the public.

The good news is going green has never been easier in Carlsbad. So in celebration of Earth Month, here are three quick ways you can get started:

1. CLOSE THAT DUMPSTER.

Every business needs water in order to operate. Protecting this limited resource is something we should all care about.

But many businesses may not realize they might be polluting our water every time it rains. When rainwater—or runoff—washes over toxic things like garbage Dumpster and machinery, it picks up pollutants, which are eventually washed into our lagoons and

it. For starters, make sure Dumpsters stay closed. Don't dump anything down your outdoor drains, either. And make sure equipment is stored inside or covered. If you'd like more ideas, visit the business resources page of our Watershed Protection Program. If you have more questions or need any more help, reach out to us at stormwater@ carlsbadca.gov.

2. COMPOST THAT COFFEE FILTER.

Organic waste makes up nearly half of everything sent to landfills. As it decomposes, organic waste produces methane gas, which is 84 times more potent than carbon dioxide and very harmful to the environment.

That's why as of July 2022, a new state law savs that all Carlsbad residents and business owners should be composting their grass clippings, food scraps and other organic materials. This includes all the paper products that are a part of office life—like pizza boxes, takeout carriers and coffee filters.

3. SKIP THE RECYCLING BAG.

About 20% of what is put into the blue recycling bins is not recyclable—including those plastic trash bags. Everything in the recycling bin should be tossed directly into the blue bin, with no bags.

As a refresher, here's what you can put in the recycling bin:

Plastics: Look on the bottom of containers

for a number inside the recycling arrows and recycle plastics numbered 1 through 7

Metal cans, aluminum foil: Recycle all food and beverage metal cans - steel, tin, bi-metal and aluminum

Cardboard, newspaper and magazines: You can also include newspaper inserts, catalogs, paperback books, phone books and brochures

Paper food containers: Recycle food boxes including juice boxes, egg, ice cream and milk cartons, and cereal and pasta boxes

Paper: Recycle envelopes, office paper, junk mail, greeting cards and file folders; paper must not be food soiled

4. GO'OFFICIALLY' GREEN.

Here at the City of Carlsbad, sustainability remains a top priority. And we're committed to helping our local businesses go green with us. That's why we launched the Green Business Program,

This free program is designed to help Carlsbad businesses operate sustainably and get some well-deserved public recognition for doing it.

By 1985, the official name of the hospital was changed to Tri-City Medical Center to reflect its growth from a "hospital" into a comprehensive, regional medical facility. As Tri-City grew, it not only expanded its services, but also its technology. Patients were able to receive modern medical services as a Magnetic Resonance Imaging Center, a Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU) and an updated Emergency Department were brought on board.

Today, Tri-City is a full-service acute care hospital with over 500 physicians practicing in over 60 specialties. Tri-City is vital to the

well-being of our community and serves as one of the region's largest employers as they employ over 1,700 people. The hospital has received many awards and is home to leading orthopedic, spine and cardiovascular health services while also specializing in world-class women's health, robotic surgery, cancer and emergency care.

JOE, WHY THE TRANSITION FROM A TELEVISION ADVERTISING AGENCY TO AN INSURANCE AND FINANCIAL SOLUTIONS AGENCY?

On March 15, 2023, the US Bureau of Economic Analysis and the National Endowment for the Arts reported the \$1 Trillion Arts and Culture Industry sector con-

tribution to the US economy in 2021. Not only was that a 13 percent increase over the previous year, but an amount greater than several industries such as construction, agriculture, mining, or transportation and warehousing.

The arts and culture sectors repre-

sented more than \$1 trillion of the US economy in 2021 and accounted for a record portion of country's overall economic value, per new data from the government.





TRI-CITY MEDICAL CENTER:

Investing in environmental sustainability

Earth Day on April 22, 2023 is a day to invest in our planet.

"At **Tri-City Medical Center,** we are committed to investing in environmental sustainability, not only for the good of our



patients and community, but for the planet as well," said Benny Oporto, Director of Facilities at the hospital. "We want to be a part of the solution and use our resources efficiently."

Currently, Tri-City Medical Center's (TCMC) Facilities Department has sev-

eral sustainability efforts underway pertaining to water conservation and energy efficiency. "Several years ago, the hospital installed flow meters on its faucets in places like public restrooms, patient rooms and kitchens to decrease the flow rate and reduce daily water consumption," said Oporto. "As smart water managers, we are not only saving water, but we are also saving on costs."

TCMC is also retrofitting lights throughout the hospital and in operating rooms. Incandescent and fluorescent bulbs are being replaced by LED bulbs, which use substantially less wattage to achieve the same or greater brightness and have a significantly longer life span before burning out. "Since the energy usage of LED bulbs is less, it positively impacts our bottom line, which means we have more money to spend on improving other areas that may impact patient care," added Oporto.



At Tri-City Medical Center, we are developing a plan on how to update the facility's infrastructure to reduce our energy consumption and costs.

In collaboration with Trane, a brand of Ingersoll Rand, TCMC is doing an energy audit of the entire hospital. "Together, we are developing a plan on how to update the facility's infrastructure to reduce our energy consumption and costs," said Oporto. "We will start with our water chillers, as they are one of the biggest consumers of energy in a hospital and part of the overall heating, ventilation and air conditioning (HVAC) system. Although this will be a large and expensive project, we know that the return on our investment will benefit our patients, as well as the environment."


TCMC is also working with Bloom Energy on a cogeneration energy project to evaluate if the hospital could build an onsite fuel cell plant to generate its own energy by converting natural gas to hydrogen, which is then used to generate electricity. "Currently, SDG&E has to generate and distribute energy to the hospital over hundreds of miles from its generating plant," said Oporto. "By using a fuel cell system, we could save on energy and costs and continue to advance our sustainability efforts."

In 2022, TCMC received the American

Society for Healthcare Engineering's Energy to Care Award, which honors healthcare facilities for their achievements in healthcare sustainability. "I'm extremely proud of the work that we are doing to keep our facility operating efficiently so that we can build a healthier community and remain environmentally sustainable for many years to come," said Oporto.

In March of 2023 we unveiled the first fully integrated, zero-emission refuse truck. The world is heating up. **Republic Services** has both a moral obligation and a business opportunity to take action. 
