# DOING OUR PART AND BECOMING



n the past 18 months, while frontline healthcare workers were fighting a global virus, another set of workers were battling a different global viral threat: cyberattacks. Rick Cassoni is the Department Chair for Computer Studies at MiraCosta College, and as someone in charge of training the future cybersecurity specialists, he knows first-hand demand for

these experts has risen considerably. "Cybersecurity became especially important not only in education environments but throughout the worldwide workforce," says Cassoni. "Having persons work from home (WFH) to contain the spread of COVID put extra pressures on cybersecurity teams for private and public companies, government, and educational entities, as persons had to log in to access systems over the internet from home, providing vectors for cyber criminals to deploy attacks versus from the safety of a physical company behind firewalls."

Assistant Special Agent in Charge at the San Diego FBI Cyber Program, Houtan Moshrefi, says that in the current environment "the most prevalent cybersecurity threats facing all companies today are Business Email Compromise (BEC) attacks, phishing, ransomware, hacking, and insider threats." However, there is one particular risk

that has stood out: ransomware. "A traditional ransomware attack will encrypt (make inaccessible) all files on a computer or server, affecting a company's ability to operate," says Moshrefi. "Modern ransomware goes a step further; malicious actors steal sensitive data and extort companies who do not pay the ransom by threatening to publish company records and data to the internet."

Unfortunately, according to Moshrefi, ransomware has driven cyber criminals to organize in a way that makes it more prolific, which he refers to as "the emergence of 'ransomware as a service."""The most sophisticated ransomware groups are increasingly offering to sell their cyber tools to less sophisticated cyber criminals as a bundle, providing both the malware and the phishing operation, payment platform, and premade data leak site. The impact of ransomware as a service is that it lowers the barrier of entry into the cyber-crime business." With this in mind, and just like in the past 18 years, the Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency (CISA) recognizes October as Cybersecurity Awareness Month in an effort to educate organizations and individuals on how to have a safe and secure online experience. Under the theme "Do Your Part. #BeCyberSmart." CISA is focusing on topics from phishing to careers in cybersecurity. Locally, Au Technology Solutions CEO and Owner, Kevin Clemons, has seen his fair share of cyber attacks. But the most common cybersecurity issue he has been deployed to address is "securing safe email services." He adds that there are three 'must haves' particularly for small businesses to protect themselves from attacks: "multifactor authentication, secure email and secure file sharing."

Moshrefi suggests that cybersecurity in an organization should start with self-examination. "Assess your current cybersecurity posture. Every organization should ask themselves: what are our present cyber risks and the potential business impact of each risk; how is executive management informed of these cyber risks and the potential business impact on the company; how are our organizations applying industry standards and best practices; and how comprehensive is our incident response plan and how often is it tested."

Luckily, organizations can trust that when cybersecurity issues arise, there will be someone that can help. A perfect example, is the MiraCosta College Cybersecurity program. "Our goal is to provide students with in-depth knowledge reinforced with hands on labs using the same tools as cybersecurity professionals, courses that help prepare students for industry certifications and both informal and formal work-based learning experiences that include classroom labs, internships, and Club IT, CSIT Department's Student Club." As someone who has spent many years in the field, Clemons believes that these three skills are also very important as the cybersecurity professionals of the future are trained: "problem solving, excellent communication and proactive attitude." For those who would like to take their career to a federal agency, Moshreti says that "the FBI is always interested in applicants with a strong computer science or cyber background." In fact, there are opportunities for both students through "student programs to include our Honors Internship and College Hiring Initiative" and for working professionals. "Applicants with a background in cybersecurity or computer science can bring those abilities to the FBI working as computer scientists, or utilize their analytical skills and cyber knowledge in positions such as Special Agent or Intelligence Analyst."

# Spotlighting the importance of cybersecurity in Carlsbad

There's an industry booming right under our noses, quite literally.

The digital devices we're constantly staring down at depend on cybersecurity — a

sector that's growina significantly here in our region. In fact, the San Diego area is home

to more than 12,400 cybers jobs that generate a \$3.5 billion impact every year. That's the same as hosting nine Super Bowls, or twenty-three Comic-Con conventions.

Let that sink in.

Because October is Cybersecurity Awareness Month, this is the perfect time to underscore this sector's local importance. From my perspective, here are top three things you should know:

# 1. The local cyber job market is red hot.

The Cyber Center of Excellence (CCOE) reports a 9% job growth projection. And 3 out of 5 cyber companies in our region say they plan to increase employment in the next year. That includes Carlsbad-based Proficio, which has been growing by about 40 percent annually.

Proficio recently moved its headquarters from Irvine to Carlsbad, largely because of

# our talent pool.

"We noticed a lot of top talent was coming from this area because of the military industry and all of the universities," said CEO Brad Taylor. "Carslbad was the perfect answer for us. This puts us closer to the talent." Proficio is making the most of that by

working directly with our local universities, ensuring students are prepared to enter the cyber workforce. California State University San Marcos (CSUSM) has an entire cybersecurity education hub, complete with resources, training and programs that reflect industry trends and needs.

Proficio also participates in programs that help local veterans transition from military service to cyber careers, including the Career Transition Assistance Plan (CTAP).

"Even as technology advances at lightning speed, we still need the next generation of professionals," Taylor said, adding that there's a tremendous talent shortage nationally.

One recent survey by a cybersecurity training nonprofit called (ISC)2 found that more than 300,000 cyber jobs go unfilled every year.

"If you enter the cyber security industry, you'll enjoy great job security and you'll never get bored,"Taylor added.

## 2. Cyber security is for everyone.

Cybercrimes have skyrocketed during the pandemic, by as much as 300 percent according to the Federal Bureau of Investigations (FBI). Even more startling: There's a cyber attack every 39 seconds in the US, according to a study by the University of Maryland.

Businesses are more at risk than ever, and virtually every business is a target. I say that not to stoke fear, but to make the point that a cybersecurity strategy must be part of any business plan today.

"If you have data, even if it's only employee data, that's valuable to hackers," said CCOE President and CEO Lisa Easterly.

As more companies are shifting operations online and allowing remote work, it's especially important that they mitigate risks such as hacks, malware, and ransomware.

Easterly says smaller businesses are especially vulnerable because they tend to be easier targets.

"Ninety five percent of breaches happen due to human error," she said. "That's why cyber education is so critical — for both business owners and their employees."

In addition to education, Easterly encourages business owners to outsource to cybersecurity professionals when it makes sense.

"Thankfully, San Diego has a robust cyber ecosystem that business owners can plug into," she said.

Bring a friend or loved one with you, especially if you feel like you have trouble retaining information or you are discussing something serious like cancer or heart disease. Be aware of any visitor restrictions in place due

Don't feel embarrassed. Your doctor isn't perfect, and he or she doesn't expect you to be either.

# 6. Be sure you understand your care plan

Before you leave the doctor's office, make sure all your questions have been answered or if you need to schedule a follow-up visit. Have a clear understanding of everything your doctor has told you about your condition and what you need to do, such as getting lab tests, taking medications and caring for yourself at home.

"If you're not quite sure about something, don't hesitate to ask for clarification before you leave," says Dr. Shragge. "If you have questions once you get home, contact your health care team by calling the office or using an online patient portal to leave a message."

## 7. Communicate with your physician, use patient portal

Many health care organizations offer patients a secure health portal in order to communicate with their physicians and manage

# **1.** Be prepared for your appointment

Take a few minutes to prepare for your appointment with your physician so you can make the most of your time together. You may be able to message your concerns ahead of your appointment through a patient portal.

Common questions to consider include:

- Do you have a new symptom you want to discuss?
- Do you want to go over how a treatment is affecting your daily life?
- What side effects are common with a particular medication you are prescribed?
- Do you need vaccines, including the flu, pneumonia or shingles?

"Before your visit, make a list of your symptoms and how long each has been present," suggests Dr. Shragge. "Write down

# 2. Prioritize health issues to discuss

Start your discussion with your physician with the most important health issue or question on your mind.

"Don't put off things you really need to discuss until the end of the visit. Bring them up right away," says Dr. Shragge.

# 3. Follow COVID safety precautions

Be prepared to follow COVID safety protocols before entering the clinic and at the doctor's office, including wearing a face covering and physical distancing. At Scripps, all physicians, staff members, patients and visitors are required to wear face coverings. Scripps also offers curbside check-in as an additional safety measure so that you can remain in your vehicle until an exam room is ready for your visit.

"Bringing a friend or family member along can be extremely helpful when it comes to asking questions and clarifying information, especially for older patients or anyone who is nervous about seeing the doctor, or someone who needs a language interpreter," says Dr. Shragge.

# 5. Be honest with your physician

Your lifestyle and daily habits impact your health, and the information you share with your physician is confidential so be candid. If you are not honest about things, such as smoking or having a couple of cocktails daily or occasionally skipping your medications, your physician won't have accurate information, and that can impact your care.

"Let your doctor know what has happened in your life since your last visit," says Dr. Shragge "For instance, mention any their health records.

Scripps Clinic and Scripps Coastal Medical Center patients can use MyScripps, the online patient portal where you can check test results, schedule appointments, review your medical history and leave messages for your physician.

# 8. Follow your care plan

Follow your individualized care plan to get results and monitor progress. Your care plan may include tasks such as monitoring your blood sugar, getting more exercise or taking your blood pressure.

If a physician's recommendation doesn't sound doable or your medication isn't working, let them know so you can re-evaluate and make adjustments to your plan.

# **Carlsbad Village businesses are hiring**

The mission of the **Carlsbad Village Association** includes supporting the efforts of the hundreds of small businesses in downtown Carlsbad as it works towards making Carlsbad Village a premier destination in North County San Diego. That is why we answered the



call by employers in the retail, restaurant and hospitality sectors when they made it known they were having trouble filling open positions by hosting an in-person job fair on Sept. 25.

lt was every business owner's assumption that after living with the

COVID-19 virus for 18 months, that business would be back to normal or at least a close version of normal. But while consumers are returning to main street to shop, dine and play, workers are not returning in levels to keep up with the demand.

The small businesses in downtown Carlsbad have shown tremendous resiliency and creativity for the past year and a half. But now they are faced with a new challenge, because of the pandemic, and this one does not come with relief funding, grants, or financial assistance from the state, county or at the local level. When they should be in full recovery mode, they are now short-staffed, and the strain is starting to show.

"I've been in this industry for a long time, and I've never worked so hard to find qualified employees," said one general manager of a fast-casual eatery in Carlsbad Village.

"We used to turn interested applicants away because we didn't have room for them. Now we're just chronically short-staffed and hoping people will just show up for their interviews." Interview no-shows are more prevalent now than ever before.

At the recent job fair, employers from the **Carlsbad Inn Beach Resort, Handel's Ice Cream**, and even the **Carlsbad Fire Department** were on site, along with over a dozen other enthusiastic businesses. Many others would have participated, but, ironically, they could not leave their businesses

long enough to attend due to being short-staffed.

"We're Hiring!" signs adorn the windows of many businesses in the Village. It is a daily topic of discussion, and the issue of a staffing shortage does not look like it will be ease up anytime soon. Meanwhile restaurants are reducing their hours of operation and retail stores are doing their best to make do with less coverage on the floor.

How can you help? First, spread the word that Carlsbad Village businesses are hiring. Part-time, full-time, salaried, per diem, you name it. The Carlsbad Village Association is teeing up a job board on its website (*www.carlsbad-village.com*) for downtown businesses to help move the needle on this problem. Second, continue to support the small businesses downtown and continue to play an active role in their recovery from the pandemic. Help them through this new and difficult phase in their recovery efforts as they learn how to meet consumer demands with less staff on hand as they search for their newest team members.



fore ours arrived). According to Inifite Dial 2020, over 75% of the US population is familiar with the term "podcasting" and over 104 million people listened to a podcast in the last month.





# CSUSM part of iPad program to help bridge digital divide a community comes together

**Cal State San Marcos** is doing its part to help bridge the digital divide that has been exacerbated by the coronavirus pandemic. CSUSM is one of eight campuses partic-



ipating in a California State University called initiative CSUCCESS (California State University Connectivity Contributing to Equity and Student Success) that aims to enhance student achievement and create more equitable opportunities for the CSU community by providing industry-lead-

ing technology.

Under the program, all CSUSM first-year and transfer students are eligible for a new iPad bundle, which includes a 64-gigabyte iPad Air, an Apple Smart Keyboard Folio and an Apple Pencil, as well as technology support from Instructional and Information Technology Services (IITS).

Students do not own the devices but can use them for the duration of their undergraduate education at CSUSM. The iPads are managed by CSUSM, which preloaded them with certain campus applications, but the university is not monitoring students' day-

to-day activities on them.

Almost 1,900 students have registered for an iPad bundle.

CSUCCESS represents the latest response by the CSU to the challenges of the pandemic, during which students have pointed to a lack of access to a computer or mobile device as an obstacle in the way of their achievement. Over the last year, for example, CSUSM has loaned 669 laptops, 191 mobile hotspots and 176 other pieces of equipment to students.

"The shift to virtual learning really highlighted the vast inequalities in home technology and connectivity," said Kevin Morningstar, dean of IITS and CSUSM's chief information officer. "While CSUSM continues to loan out equipment to any student who doesn't have a device, the CSUCCESS program really builds beyond that, by ensuring that every incoming student has the opportunity to receive a high-quality and reliable personal computing device to support their academic achievement."

The program is focused on new students, who need more support as they begin their college careers, particularly in light of the ongoing COVID-19 challenges. Future phases of CSUCCESS, however, could include returning students.

Dawn Formo, dean of the Office of Undergraduate Studies, said she has convened a group that is studying the value of the CSUCCESS initiative as it pertains to new students' academic progress. She said the group is supporting faculty of first-year students with pedagogical support for including iPads in their course design, which includes providing participating faculty with iPads as well.

"We are committed to finding meaningful ways to use the iPads to close equity gaps by helping students understand iPad tools that can help them thrive and deepen their learning experience," Formo said.

Funding for CSUCCESS, which could serve up to 35,000 students across California, comes from federal Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund resources.

The other seven CSU campuses participating in the initiative are Bakersfield, Channel Islands, Fresno, Humboldt, Los Angeles, Maritime Academy and Northridge.

# The importance of arts in your child's life

We know that involving young children in visual art, music, and creative movement supports the development of fine motor control, visual learning, and a host of important skills. Despite this knowledge, reg-



ular arts opportunities tend to diminish as children progress through elementary school.

Students who pursue art outside of school usually experience it in an isolated way, such as individual instrument lessons.



This limited exposure is common for students entering our middle school. At this age, students often think the arts are reserved for "talented people" and most assume they lack the necessary talent. Or, they (or their parents) have adopted the label "math/science kid" or "humanities kid." Many people think of the arts as something practiced on the side.

At Pacific Ridge, we believe arts education is essential and consider it part of our core curriculum.

The benefits of arts education are powerful. Visual and performing arts are perfect for cultivating a growth mindset, the empowering view that abilities aren't fixed and can be developed through effort. Creative problem-solving, communication, and collaboration – key career skills – are fostered.

One of the most important benefits of arts education is how it broadens the way

we view the world and approach challenges. CEOs often state that they value employees who bring creativity to the job. Rather than specific creative abilities, it is this mindset that sets employees apart.

Of course, practicing and appreciating the arts are also important sources personal happiness throughout our lives.

For all these reasons, at Pacific Ridge we immerse our middle schoolers in multiple art forms – at least three or four through grade 8 – and provide opportunities for students to apply the arts to "real-world" multi-disciplinary projects. Students in both middle and high school gain confidence from our arts program and realize that talent can be cultivated, and

### art can be experienced in all aspects of life.

Parents sometimes ask me how to involve their children in the arts. Here are some thoughts.

- 1) Start young. Beginning to learn before age 6-7 is developmentally optimal.
- 2) Be social. Children are more likely to en-
- joy art when experienced with others. 3) Allow sampling. Let your child explore different disciplines to find one that captivates them.
- 4) Think broadly. There are many forms of artistic expression, including creative writing and poetry.

5) Promote it. Be a voice supporting arts

# education in your child's school. 6) Live it. Make art part of your family's everyday life. Sing or play instruments together; go to museums and art festivals; and attend dance, music, and theater performances.

The arts provide young people with a way to express thoughts, feelings, and hopes. Art connects them to their own culture and the wider world. As mentioned, it provides lifelong personal and career benefits. Simply put, art matters.


