One month into the COVID pandemic, the number shot up to 600,000 per month. This organization's amazing work during that time helped them win "Nonprofit of the Year" honors at our 2022 CBAD Awards.

The Food Bank recently moved into a new North County home that greatly expanded their capacity here in our community. This is an exciting development as the need for services has not leveled off much since COVID started. Casey Castillo, CEO of the Jacobs & Cushman San Diego Food Bank, shared, "The San Diego Food Bank is the largest hunger relief organization in San Diego County. We are currently serving half-a-million

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# Womens business energy on the rise

ctober is National Women's Small Business Month and a great time to recognize the achievements of our city's female entrepreneurs and the positive impact they make on our local economy. When we look at the numbers, 11.6 million women-owned businesses in the U.S., generating over \$1.7 trillion and creating jobs to employ 9 million people, it's no surprise the positive contributions women bring by building and owning a business.

Did you know, over the past year San Diego was named one of the top 5 cities nationwide for starting a women-owned micro-business?! According to a recent study by GoDaddy Venture Forward, a multi-year research initiative that studies the impact of micro-businesses on local economies, measured what is fueling the increase in women-owned business. They found that "Women are responsible for over half (54.3%) of new micro-business starts since the onset of the pandemic, a jump of 10% versus pre-pandemic levels."

Venture Forward's Alexandra Rosen, Senior Director says, "For each everyday entrepreneur, two or more jobs are created in a community. Supporting local female entrepreneurs not only makes our communities thrive, but their businesses enable more economic opportunity and prosperity." As a Carlsbad native, I know first-hand that these businesses, just like our one-of-a-kind Mexican

food, local artwork, beach sunsets and cafes are what drive our city.

It's no secret the economy has been a bit of a rollercoaster. Inflation and a tight labor-market have affected a number of our businesses. But there's a bright spot here in Carlsbad. Our startup scene is still going strong, and steadily building momentum.

In fact, in 2021, Carlsbad startups saw record-breaking funding. From seed capital to

post-IPO equity, 25 local startups raised more than \$1 billion in funding. And 2022 is continuing that momentum, with over half a billion in funding already going to 23 Carlsbad companies by the end of August.

All of this is incredibly impressive.

And it's encouraging because startups are a catalyst for economic growth. They create well-paying jobs and drive investment in our community.

They also put Carlsbad on the map in a big way. Case in point: we were recently ranked as one of the nation's best places for startups. In March, a study by Crowdfund Capital Advisors ranked Carlsbad number 9 on a list of the 100 best cities for startups.

The study analyzed US cities that offer the best odds for success when it comes to starting a business. This included vetting data from more than 5,000 companies that have raised money online and primarily from local investors and evaluates a number of other metrics.

All of this underscores just how promising our local startup scene is. We think that's worth celebrating, and that's precisely what

people per month. In 2021 alone, we distributed 60 million pounds of food around the county, with 15 million of that being in North County."

Each October the food bank focuses on peanut butter as peanut butter donations have always been the gold standard. You might ask, "Why?" Quoting the North County Food Bank's website, "Peanut butter is an excellent source of protein for children and families. It is popular with kids. Plus, it's shelf-stable, and one jar can provide more than 12 sandwiches!" Additionally, peanut butter is expensive for the food bank to purchase on its own. Unfortunately, since the onset of the pandemic, physical donations of food at the food bank warehouses have decreased. Therefore, it is time for us to step it up!

In 2021, 5,270 pounds of peanut butter were donated. More is needed in 2022. You can do your part in a variety of ways. First, you can stop by the Carlsbad Chamber of Commerce's office and bring your peanut butter to us as we are an official collection center. We are located at 5934 Priestly Drive and you can come by anytime between 9:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. Monday through Friday through the entire month of October. Secondly, for our business members, you can also donate peanut butter via our October Happy Hour. On October 19 we will be at **Hera Hub** in Carlsbad from 5:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. Anyone who brings two jars of peanut butter gets in for free. By the way, please bring plastic jars of peanut butter, not glass. Of course, financials donations are welcome as well. Every dollar donated to the Food Bank provides 2 meals for hungry San Diegans.

And if you really want to be a super donor, bring some peanut butter and a pack of diapers! Yes, DIAPERS! The Jacobs & Cushman San Diego Food Bank is one of only three diaper banks in the entire state of California. Casey shared, "On average, we distribute about 800,000 diapers per month and in December, 2021 we distributed over one million."

One in seven people in North County are food insecure. More disturbing is the fact that one in five children in North County are food insecure. Being food insecure literally means that these community members of ours do not know how they will get their next meal. Let's make a collective impact and show those community members we care! And if your office wants to get in on the fun and collect peanut butter (and diapers), just let us know. We'd be happy to swing by and pick them up at the end of the October to add to our collection at the Chamber.

Carlsbad Village has long been home to colorful street banners that hang year-round on light poles throughout the downtown area. During the holidays the street banners are changed out for seasonal designs





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

# Business student's passion leads to becoming entrepreneur

Sophia Lombardi discovered a love for sewing and entrepreneurship during the pandemic.

The Cal State San Marcos student picked up sewing as a hobby when she

had extra time on her hands. Wanting to be resourceful because fabric was expensive and she had limited funds, she saved her leftover scraps, not knowing what she would end up doing with them.

Little did she know it would set her on the path to a burgeoning career. Those fabric scraps

that Lombardi saved became the basis for sustainably made swimsuits and the creation of a business, Amalfi Swiim.

Lombardi proposed her sustainable business model as part of a quick pitch contest through CSUSM's Innovation Hub, winning a \$500 microgrant for her work on Amalfi Swiim. The contest closely resembled the TV show "Shark Tank."

Lombardi curated her brand name while reminiscing about the time she visited Positano on the Amalfi coast of Italy with a cousin and aunt (the extra "i" in Amalfi Swiim is because her preferred Instagram handle was taken).

As Lombardi began sewing in the early stages of the pandemic, she searched for inspiration and came across a novel technique that she incorporated into her work. She started to play with the leftover scraps she had saved and molded them together to create her first swimsuit without using any new material.

"I don't think I would have started my journey if I waited to put everything in place to make sure it was perfect before," said Lombardi, a business administration student who will graduate in spring 2023. "I think if you have an idea, just go for it, make it and get it manufactured, whatever it is."

Lombardi created a TikTok video that showed her process of sewing a bikini. The video went viral with more than 11 million views, and seeing the comments made her realize that her sustainable sewing efforts by utilizing leftover fabric scraps were having an impact. "It clicked for me that I could actually have a bigger mission, which is to decrease the world's pollution rate," Lombardi said.

Lombardi decided that her zero-waste swimsuit could be a statement piece in her clothing line because it stands for sustainability awareness. She also creates tote bags with the same innovative sewing technique.

Lombardi connected with other small businesses, and she now accepts donations of fabric scraps. She has reached out to over 50 local swimwear brands; one of her main providers is Amy's Sport Co., a golf clothing brand she interned for as a high school senior in Palm Springs.

Becoming a business owner in college is a huge time commitment for Lombardi. She spends up to 20 hours a week marketing, sewing and using social media to promote Amalfi Swiim while being a full-time student and a member of the CSUSM Entrepreneur-

After juggling everything herself at the outset, Lombardi has hired a fellow CSUSM student to help her sew, allowing her to focus more on marketing the business. She plans to apply her prize from the quick pitch contest toward establishing Amalfi Swiim through a legal entity.

"I have all my sights set on growing this business after college," Lombardi said. "It has been quite a ride, and it's definitely stressful to have so many obligations. But at the end of the day, I'm choosing this for myself. I really am passionate about starting a business in college so that I can support myself financially by the time I graduate."

## Celebrating menopause, the end is just the beginning!

I don't feel beautiful anymore. I feel old and wrinkled and my hair is thinning. I'm depressed and can't sleep. "These are some of the 'glass half empty' comments that I often hear from my mature patients going



through pause," said Kari Lynn Purcott, MD, a board-certified obstetrician/gynecologist at Pacific View OB/GYN, Tri-City Medical Center's newest OB/GYN clinic. "But I try to encourage them to see the 'glass half full' and celebrate this time

in their lives. Menopause is the beginning of freedom from monthly periods, cramps and worrying about getting pregnant."

"I also reinforce that menopause is a normal part of the aging process and that it is OK to talk about it," added Dr. Purcott. "Women readily share issues related to pregnancy but are often afraid to open up about their experiences during menopause. I've seen the relief on my patients' faces when they finally get over that fear and self-imposed shame. Once they ask questions and learn what is happening to their bodies, they realize that they are not 'broken' and feel empowered. It makes me so happy to see them embrace this change."

Menopause occurs when a woman's ovaries no longer produce eggs and the level of estrogen and progesterone, female hormones, declines. A woman officially reaches menopause only after it has been 12 months since her last period. From this point on, a woman can no longer have children and will be in "postmenopause."

Women may begin to experience menopause symptoms during their mid to late forties, and most will reach this milestone by age 52, according to the Office on Women's Health at the U.S. Department of Health & Human Services. This transition period,

which may last about four years, is referred to as "perimenopause" and is often when women begin to see irregularities in their periods and experience symptoms, such as hot flashes, night sweats, vaginal dryness and low libido due to changes in hormone

"It's important for women to understand that just like they are uniquely different, so too will be the ways in which they experience these symptoms and the treatments that work most effectively for them," said Dr. Purcott. "Some women will only have few hot flashes throughout the day, while others will have many and these hot flashes can last for one to five minutes or more. Fortunately, there are several treatment options and lifestyle changes to improve these various symptoms that may continue for years."

Hormone therapy entails either estrogen therapy or combination therapy (estrogen and progesterone) if a woman still has her uterus. It is sometimes called hormone replacement therapy, or HRT, and the drug is synthetic (man-made). According to the American College of Obstetrics and Gynecology (ACOG), there are different forms of hormone therapy: pills, skin patches, gels and sprays are used to release the hormone into the bloodstream so that it travels to the appropriate part of the body, whereas vaginal rings, tablets and creams release the hormone directly into the vaginal tissue. As with any prescription medication, there may be some risks such as heart disease, stroke or breast cancer. Women should discuss dose. duration, regimen and route of administration with their doctor based on their individual needs.

"The standard of care for treating menopause symptoms is hormone therapy," said Dr. Purcott. "Local vaginal treatments for dryness are very safe as they are at a lower dose and only affect that area of the body. Although some of my patients use supplements, I do not recommend them as they are only weakly supported by scientific evidence, if at all. Similarly, hormone pellet therapy is a new option that may prove beneficial but is currently not regulated by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA)."

Hormone pellet therapy is an in-office, minimally invasive procedure during which a doctor places implants, smaller than a grain of rice, under the skin near the hip that slowly and continuously release hormones over three to six months. These "compounded bioidentical" hormone pellets contain a mixture of hormones that are derived from plants that mimic human hormones. These drugs are prescribed off-label by a physician, customized for each woman and mixed by a licensed pharmacist.


Exercising, eating a healthy diet, losing weight, quitting smoking, meditating and getting enough sleep are all lifestyle changes that may help to improve symptoms. "Changes in a woman's body from childbirth, age, menopause or genetics can weaken her pelvic floor and may cause urinary incontinence," added Dr. Purcott. "Strengthening the muscles in the pelvic floor through Kegel exercises, can help. I often recommend a woman physical therapist who specializes in the female pelvic floor to work with my patients to get these muscles back in shape."

Most symptoms will eventually subside over time and become more related to aging than menopause. Since women are at greater risk for conditions such as heart disease, stroke and osteoporosis when they reach postmenopause, it is essential that they continue to see a doctor.

"As women, I think we're fabulous because we are," said Dr. Purcott. "It may take a little bit more effort for a woman to understand her body and really get to know what's normal, which is why I am passionate about teaching my female patients about menopause, so that we can celebrate this time in their lives. The end is just the beginning!"

My husband and I have been members of the Carlsbad Chamber of Commerce





was nearing capacity. Utility scale solar and storage power plants are in development. Thousands of electric vehicles are going to hit the road in 2023. As a


