#### The early history and founding of The Flower Fields

As you have probably heard by now, 2023 is the Carlsbad Chamber of Commerce's centennial year. To celebrate our

100-year heritage, I will use this column throughout the year to share Chamber's impact. Most of my research rides on the coattails of our own Chamber website, other legacy organizations' websites and

more.

You might think that the Carlsbad Chamber of Commerce grew as the community grew - starting small and growing gradually over the years. Actually, the Chamber stayed small for only a couple of years before literally exploding. The Chamber began in 1923 but its history before 1926 is sketchy. At first there were fewer than 20 members and only three or four regularly attended meetings. That would change quickly, however. By 1926 – when the earliest editions of the Carlsbad Champion (Carlsbad's local newspaper) are available – the Chamber was holding weekly Board meetings and monthly dinner meetings for the entire community. These dinners attracted crowds as large as 350 people.

With no city government - and county government 35 miles away in San Diego – the Chamber quickly became the voice of the community. The agenda for a community dinner meeting in April of 1926 included discussion of the following

- Tree trimming by the electric company.
- Distribution of Chamber membership signs.
- Opening Kelly Slew to the ocean because it smelled.
- Building and painting of street signs.
- · Lobbying the U.S. Post Office Department for daily Rural Route service.
- Producing a promotional pamphlet about the community.

As you can see, the Chamber was acting like our City Council nearly three decades before we had one. And because the Chamber was where the action was in the 1920s, reports on its meetings were at the top of the Carlsbad Champion front page every Thursday. In 1926, their weekly Board luncheons were held on Mondays at the Twin Inns. Monthly meetings were held on Friday nights at the schoolhouse with dinner served by the Woman's Club. The price was 75 cents a plate, and 35 cents for children.

No doubt the early success of the Chamber was due to the inspired leadership of our first president, Roy Chase, who moved to Carlsbad with his wife Idella and family from the Midwest in 1915.

In a brief time, Chase became postmaster, railroad station agent and opened a small grocery story, all operating out of the Carlsbad Depot. Within a few years he expanded his store, became a sales agent for South Coast Land Company and started his own trucking and construction businesses. Among the buildings he put up were the Los Diego Hotel, the sanctuary of the Carlsbad Union Church and the town's first theater. In his spare time he served on the school board and his wife was a charter member of the Carlsbad Woman's Club and supervised the small beginnings of a public library in their general store. As if he didn't have enough to do, Chase started the Chamber of Commerce, serving as president for the first two years and returning again in

The couple's tradition of community involvement was carried on when their daughter Dee Chase married Dewey McClellan, a real estate agent who later became Chamber president in 1932 and 1946 and then became the first mayor of Carlsbad in 1952.

Another prominent citizen followed Chase as president of the Chamber in 1924: Luther Gage. Luther

Gage was a flower grower who developed a new strain of a hard-to-pronounce flower called "ranunculus." Today's famous Flower Fields are descendants of Gage's original bulbs. Today we celebrate nearly 100-years of floral heritage and agritourism in Carlsbad. Gage was also responsible for introducing the gladiolus to

In 1926, when W.T. Hart was president, the Champion newspaper reported that "Carlsbad, with a population of 1,500, has a Chamber of Commerce membership of 350" and described a dinner meeting at the Twin Inns attended by 354 people!

In 1936 and 1937, during the depths of the Depression, the Chamber went on a hiatus, with very few meetings held. In 1938-39, Chamber president Sam Fraser helped revive the organization with a new twist. The group was called the Carlsbad Community Improvement Club in hopes that it would attract residents, in addition to businessmen. The Improvement Club continued in 1940 with Oliver Morris as president, but in October, the name "Carlsbad Chamber of Commerce" was reestablished.

Next month we will discuss the Chamber's role in converting Carlsbad into its own incorporated city.

#### Supporting Black-owned businesses is good for our economy

Black people represent 12.8% of our nation, yet only 2.4% of U.S. businesses have Black owners, according to research by the Alliance for Entrepreneurial Equity (AEE). That disproportion has significant implications.

In fact, the AEE es-

timates that if Blackowned businesses were proportionate to the population, it would mean 738,000 more businesses would create nearly 7 million more jobs in Black communities and \$733 billion more in revenue.

Black-owned busi-

nesses create opportunity, builds up community, enriches culture, and makes for a more resilient economy.

Carlsbad is proud to be home to a number of Black-owned businesses and in honor of Black History Month, we wanted to recognize a few of the entrepreneurs behind these companies.

#### **Elaine Swann, Founder and Owner of The Swann School of Protocol**

If you've wondered whether your email manners are on point, or if you're tipping an appropriate amount, The Swann School of **Protocol** may be for you.

Elaine Swann started the institute after struggling with her own social inhibitions. She conquered them through years of training, becoming an etiquette expert.

"After gaining that knowledge, I knew I wanted to help others feel graceful, confident and complete," she said of the inspiration behind The Swann School of Protocol.

Twenty years later, her business is booming. She and her staff offer certifications, corporate training, classes and courses at their 1,500-square-foot facility in Carlsbad.

"What makes us unique is that we keep up with the times," Elaine added. "As things like mask etiquette and social distancing have emerged during the pandemic, we've adapted along with new social norms."

Elaine is thankful for how the Carlsbad business community has embraced hersomething she said "has meant so much, especially as a woman of color building a business. I'm the first entrepreneur in my family. And in fact, a first-generation American, as my family immigrated here from Panama."

Her path to success has taken hard work, and this Black History Month, she's celebrating how far she and so many others have come.

"I started my business in my garage and now I have the blessing of being an employer to others so they can earn rewarding livelihoods, "she said.

#### Kevin Clemons, Founder and Owner of Au Technology Solutions

Did you know that small businesses are three times more likely to be targeted by cybercriminals than larger companies?

It's something Kevin Clemons knows all too well—and a big reason he launched his company, Au Technology Solutions.

"We specialize in serving small businesses because having an in-house IT department is often cost-prohibitive for them—but that's where we can help," he said.

Kevin and his team offer cybersecurity, helpdesk support, network monitoring, system repair, staff training and more.

"We don't outsource anything. All of our talent is local, which means we always have fast response times," he added.

As a North County native, local roots matter to Kevin. He started Au Technology Solutions a decade ago after serving in the US Navy and knew that Carlsbad was precisely where he wanted to headquarter his

"Carlsbad is the holy grail if you're serving other businesses. There are so many small businesses here, and supporting local businesses is the biggest thing you can do to uplift your community."

Even with community support, as a Black entrepreneur, Kevin said it hasn't always been easy because access to capital and mentorship haven't been readily available.

He recently helped Microsoft shape its Black Channel Partner Association, which helps scale Black-owned technology businesses. For the last two years, Kevin has also served as President of the San Diego Chapter of the International Association of Microsoft Channel Partners.

"Seeing Microsoft invest in my business has been amazing to see," he reflected. "Even in the last couple of years, I've seen access to resources improve and that's meaningful

#### Stephanie Barneburg, Founder and **Owner of Sparkle Freshness**

When Stephanie Barneburg first became a mother, her son was born three months premature. It was an understandable stressful time, and she still remembers the anxiety of bringing him home.

"I remember the hospital staff was telling me how important it was to keep our home clean and free of chemicals. My son was very delicate, and as his mother, it was now my job to provide a safe home for him. As a new mom, that really hit a cord for me," she recalled.

She went home and started investigating all the chemicals in her household cleaners.

"I was floored by how harsh these ingredients were, and how they can literally be toxic if you combine them," she said. "The longterm impacts of these chemicals can be detrimental, and many of us don't realize it."

From that moment on, she committed to natural cleaning remedies—and while she didn't know it then, this would be the start of her entrepreneurial journey.

Over the next several years, she studied natural cleaning and its many benefits. In 2011, she decided to take her knowledge to market by starting Sparkle Freshness, a commercial cleaning company that specializes in being green.

Today, her company has grown to include a full staff who serve many companies across North County.

"We have a deep-rooted foundation and gratitude to be here in Carlsbad, where so many businesses understand the value of sustainable living. Fifty years ago, I couldn't have run a business this successful as a Black woman," she said. "New things are being made possible. So, for me, Black History Month is about celebrating how far we've come—and how far we will continue to go."

These are just a few examples of some of the great Black-owned businesses we have in Carlsbad and our surrounding region. Collectively, these entrepreneurs contribute tremendously to the fabric of Carlsbad, and our nation. Supporting them has a positive ripple effect in our community and our economy.

# MiraCosta Board of Trustee reorganization

MiraCosta College governing board members Rick Cassar, Raye Clendening, and



Bill Fischer were officially sworn into new four-year terms during the December 15, 2022, Board of Trustees meeting at MiraCosta's Oceanside Campus member Pedroza will be PRESIDENT sworn in during the January 2023 meeting). At the same meeting, Trustee

Frank Merchat and Rick Cassar were unanimously selected by their peers who were present to serve as President and Vice President of the board for the coming year.

Trustee Frank Merchat was selected by his peers to serve as President of the Board of Trustees. Merchat represents Area 4 in the eastern part of Carlsbad and was appointed to the Board in April 2015. Prior to his appointment to the Board of Trustees, Merchat served for five years on the MiraCosta College Foundation Board of Directors. During his time on the foundation board, he had the honor of being a member and chairperson of the development committee, as well as being a member of the finance committee. After working for thirty years in the computer and software

industries, Merchat pursued his lifelong dream of building his own company. He is currently the founder and managing director of Night Oak LLC, a commercial real estate investment company.

"I am honored to be elected president of the MiraCosta Community College District's governing board. I am excited to continue our work at expanding student success and student access as we burnish our credentials as a leader in higher education," explains Merchat. "I am passionate about working with my colleagues to position our college in anticipation and plan for the future."

Trustee Rick Cassar was chosen by his colleagues to serve as board Vice President. Cassar represents Area 2, which includes Solana Beach, Cardiff, and Rancho Santa Fe. A first-generation college student and first-generation American, Cassar was first elected to the Board of Trustees in 2014. A proud California resident since 1982 and a Cardiff resident since 1995, Cassar is a retired counselor, psychology professor, and department chair at the San Diego Community College District.

The selection of the Board President and Vice President came at the Trustees' annual organizational session. Three of the board's seven members took the oath office for new four-year terms.

Raye Clendening represents Area 6, the northernmost part of the District, and in-





nessman and Carlsbad resident, along with Vice

President of the Board of Trustees, Rick Cassar.

cludes Camp Pendleton. The longtime educator served as a teacher and principal before overseeing student services and special education programs at the Oceanside Unified School District. She was appointed in June to fill the remaining term for the seat once held by trustee David Broad, who resigned. She has a bachelor's degree in child development from Cal State Los Angeles and a master's degree in educational leadership administration from Azusa Pacific University.

Bill Fischer represents Area 7, which includes northeast Oceanside. First elected to the Board of Trustees in 2010, Fischer taught English for 33 years at the State University of New York at Buffalo and moved to Oceanside following his retirement. The Navy veteran earned a bachelor's degree in English from Williams College and a doctorate in

English from UC Berkeley.

Anna Pedroza, who will take the oath during the January 2023 meeting, represents Area 1, which includes Del Mar and Carmel Valley, and was first appointed to the Board of Trustees in September 2017. The Del Mar resident has served in several regional, state, and national educational organizations, including the Association of California School Administrators. She holds a master's degree in educational administration from San Diego State University.

All four ran unopposed in the June primaries, negating a need for a November vote.

"The MiraCosta Community College District is in good hands with its leadership team. I congratulate trustees Cassar, Clendening, Fischer, and Pedroza on serving another term and Frank Merchat and Rick Cassar on being selected board President and Vice President," said Superintendent/ President Sunita "Sunny" Cooke, Ph.D. "Their commitment, experience, connection to the community, and dedication to serving our students is invaluable."

The MiraCosta Community College District includes the Main Campus in Oceanside, the San Elijo Campus in Cardiff, the Community Learning Center in Oceanside, and the Technology Career Institute in Carlsbad. In addition to its associate degrees, certificate programs, and transfer courses, MiraCosta is one of only 15 community colleges in California to offer a bachelor's degree.

congregate in the large conference room. They bonded, built cross-industry relationships that certainly benefitted business, but also built life-long friends and mentorships. I thought this would be perfect and amazing for everyone, but I learned why it had been quiet too. Participation takes serious dedication and commitment to yourself and others.

I had written about NetForce pre-COVID, but finally following the lockdown delays we are pleased to announce the growth and new valuable opportunity for Chamber members. History is critical to understand why this is a big, longtime coming moment.

Back in 2009, the founders of the first NetForce group had the mission to create a new benefit for members, specifically related to business development. It began with research on several well-known networking and referral-generating programs throughout the county, and interviews with their participants. It was discovered



that many people didn't like their groups they were committed to for a few main reasons. 1) The group may have 40 people, but many would only refer 2-3 people since they may not trust the rest. 2) They felt the group had too many strict rules. 3) The cost was just too high.

The Carlsbad Chamber's result of the investigation was the creation of NetForce as a unique hybrid of structure, member selection, low investment, and FUN. While in many ways NetForce is similar to other networking groups, it has proven to be extremely effective for each participating member. In the first year of the first group alone, more than \$100,000 in business was generated. And interestingly, members say one of the most surprising benefits was how they became their existing clients' greatest resource for all kinds of products and services. This is because their clients trusted them, and the members could now confidently refer fellow NetForce members to their clients. The resulting trust and confidence levels skyrocketed all around in the groups, and with that came more dollars.

These groups provide connection, inspiration, motivation, accountability, and referrals for members. The meetings are highly energetic, personally compelling, professionally productive, and again, fun. Members also meet one-on-one to build trust and grow their direct relationships outside of the weekly meetings.

As of February 1, the Carlsbad Chamber now has four NetForce groups meeting weekly. Prospective NetForce members are welcome to attend two meetings before submitting their application to join. Each group is limited to one person per industry, and each one is looking for members in varying industries to join. 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

## The Fit3D Scanner—Tri-City Medical Center's high-tech tool customizes patients' weight loss journey

January is the time of year when people prioritize healthy habits and weight loss to achieve their New Year's resolutions. "I



think it's good to resolutions." said Kern Brar, MD, a board-certified internist at **Tri-City** Primary Care. "Recognizing that we are not happy with our current state of affairs, forces us to move away from denial toward acceptance, to take action to resolve to do

something different or better than the year before."

"The patients I see are all motivated to lose weight, but for various reasons," added Dr. Brar. "Some do it because they want to be able to attend a child's wedding or get down on their hands and knees to play with grandkids. Others are trying to better manage their diabetes or hypertension and reduce the number of medications they take. Patients are often referred to me by orthopedic surgeons after hip or back surgery to relieve some of the pressure on their joints or by plastic surgeons whose patients want to lose their 'love handles.' With the Fit3D scanner, we now have one of the most hightech tools available to help patients meet their weight loss goals."

The Fit3D scanner is designed to accurately track data such as circumference measurements, body composition, body shape

rating, basal metabolic rate (BMR), lean muscle mass, posture analytics, weight, balance and more, while displaying this information in a dashboard on any internet enabled device. After stepping onto the machine's circular platform, patients hold onto handles while it gently rotates for about a minute so that the non-invasive scanner can create a full body, 3D silhouette avatar of themselves. Once a baseline is established, the data can be used to compare patients to others based on gender and age; subsequent scans can be used to track weight loss progress.

"I review the detailed Fit3D report with my patients so that we can customize their weight loss journey," said Dr. Brar. "By accurately measuring patients' BMR, which is the number of calories burned while at rest, we can better determine ways to increase their lean mass and decrease body fat through a balance of exercise and good nutrition."

"Understanding body fat percentage is increasingly important," added Dr. Brar. "For years, we have understood its relationship to diabetes and hypertension, but now we

are seeing correlations between it and cancers such as oral, gastric, colon and breast. Studies are showing that weight loss for chemotherapy and cancer patients helps them with their immunity."

Although the Fit3D scanner is available at a handful of gyms and physical therapy facilities throughout San Diego, TCPC is the only hospital-affiliated clinical practice in North County to currently offer this technology. Dr. Brar, who prefers a natural approach to health, integrates this tool with medically monitored weight loss to encourage accountability and behavior modification based on data.

"At the end of the day, most patients want to lose weight to improve their quality of life so they can spend more time with family and loved ones," said Dr. Brar. "We see many husbands and wives come in together, as well as neighbors or golf and tennis partners because they want to support one another."

"At Tri-City Primary Care, we also provide individualized support through monthly check-ins, as well as tools, such as the FIT 3D scanner, to customize their weight loss journey so that they can achieve their New Year's resolutions and maintain their healthy habits. Data is powerful and doesn't lie. My patients are happy with their results, which makes me happy and reassured that we are on the right path to helping people!"



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# Another year, more tax law changes

Along with new 2023 tax law changes, comes the responsibility of making sure your financial plan is up to date.

First, it's a good time to revisit your budget and make sure you are maximizing your Retirement Savings. Chances are you made your budget for the new year in January, it doesn't hurt to take a second look and make sure you are on track and realistic

about your lifestyle expenses.

Second, the IRS recently announced contribution increases for 2023 that included 401K limit increases to \$22,500 and IRA limit rises to \$6,500. If you have not updated your contributions yet for 2023, make sure you do

Third, you might have heard that the recently passed Secure 2.0 Act is a piece of legislation that aims to make it easier for Americans to save for retirement. It was part of a \$1.7 trillion omnibus spending package that was passed by Congress and signed into law at the end of 2022.

Here are some of the Secure 2.0 Act highlights.

- •The required minimum distribution (RMD) age will increase from age 72 to age 73 and then to age 75 in 2033. The penalty for not taking a RMD will be reduced from the current 50% to 25%, and in some instances to 10%.
- · Catch-up contributions for most workplace retirement plans will increase to

\$10,000 for workers between the ages of 60 through 63, beginning in 2025. Currently, participants age 50 and older can contribute an additional catch-up contribution of \$7,500 per year in their 401K

- · Beginning in 2024, employers can provide their employees with 401(k) contribution matches based on their workers' student loan payments.
- Plan sponsors can create "emergency savings accounts" that allow non-highly compensated employees to make Roth after-tax contributions to a special savings account within the retirement plan.
- The Secure 2.0 Act will require companies

to auto enroll workers into 401k plans. Beginning in 2025, companies with new 401k and 403b plans will automatically enroll their employees into these plans at a minimum contribution rate of 3% to 10%. The rate will increase 1% each year up to 15%. Small businesses with 10 or fewer employees, new businesses, church plans and governmental plans will be exempt, according to an official summary of the Act.

· A new rule allows 529 plan money to be rolled into a Roth IRA for the beneficiary starting in 2024. The amount that can be rolled over each year is the Roth IRA contribution limit, which

is \$6500 this year. You can't roll more than \$35,000 total in a beneficiaries' lifetime. Another condition is the 529 plan must have been opened for at least 15 years.

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# Take a closer look at the New Village mural

We're fortunate to live, work and enjoy a distinctive array of creativity throughout Carlsbad. There are many wonderful creative sector businesses that embrace

a spirit to enliven daily life like Barrio Glassworks, North Coastal Art Gallery, and Carlsbad Music Festival, along with many murals activating dynamic visual experiences in the Village.

There's an exciting art element that brings a new face to

the Village through a stunning mural titled "Passengers" at the newly renovated Dea Hurston **New Village Arts** Center. New Village Arts has a long history in the City of Carlsbad, and the city has supported its development including the recent renova-

The city's Cultural Arts staff, led by Cultural Arts Manager Richard Schultz, collaborated with New Village Arts, Carlsbad Village Association and the **North County Transit District** to select an artist and a design concept for this large-scale mural project. Inspired by the spirit of innovation in the city's Arts & Culture Master Plan, the mural started with an idea of a creating a truly Carlsbad-centric arts experience. The design and fabrication of the mural was completed by Arizona-based artist Clyde as a nod to New Village Arts Center, the Carlsbad beach culture, movement and travel by spanning the approximately 97 feet wide and 16 feet high west-facing wall.

Clyde's mural, titled "Passengers," was finished in November 2022 and unveiled last month. Clyde commented, "The glass vases are a metaphor for vessels and the ranunculus are the life, traveling together through time." Clyde believes the common denominator between the ocean, the Village Coaster Station, and the New Arts Village Theatre were all unique characters that work in unison. He added, "The hundreds of fish that travel together in the flow of a current, the hundreds of unique individuals that come together to travel in the same vessel, and the many characters that work together to put on a show for the

Like the Coaster moving people from one place to another, the figure is posed in a theatrical stance, as guiding theatre goers to the entrance. Clyde has a very unique and distinctive color palette and incorporative hyper-realistic figurative work in a fine art-style. He is intrigued how the architecture of the building will interact with his design. His palette of neutral tones evokes energy and movement, creating an inviting and welcoming environment. This is perfect for visitors new to Carlsbad, avid theatre goers, restaurant enthusiasts or locals taking a stroll in the Village. Clyde's design is interactive. Here's an idea for a photo opportunity for social media: A person can stand near the mural, and act as if they are holding up the glass bottle with a reflection of the Carlsbad Village Coaster Stop and the surrounding palm tree, capturing the perfect moment in time in Carlsbad.

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


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




The largest/most expensive is Vistage at \$1,600/mo., however, typical costs are \$500-\$1,200/mo. Some groups include 1-on-1 coaching; for others it's an option.

# Utility rates skyrocket while commercial energy storage systems take root in CA

Affordability for homeowners and businesses are a growing concern as California works toward a "future grid" to meet the increased consumption from electric vehicles, extreme heat conditions and seasonal peak demand. Utility electricity cost is rising faster than inflation and many business owners are seeking to reduce operating costs with renewable energy.

After April 2023, solar grid-tie only systems without a storage system to harness excess power will become less common due to the adjusted pay-back period for net energy metering.

What is NEM 3.0?

NEM 3.0 is a new version of net energy metering policy proposed by the CPUC. The rate structure for importing and exporting power from the utility grid will change for both homes and businesses. Solar + storage adopters are a part of the solution to meeting urgent climate goals by reducing load and/or exporting energy during peak times, starting April 2023.

There is a clean energy shortfall in the evening hours when the sun is down, which forces California to rely on fossil fuels to meet evening demand. NEM 3.0's directive pushes for solar plus storage pairing because the issue isn't generating solar electricity in California; it's storing and using it later.

The first and most critical point is the changing rate structure that will reduce the value of solar energy if you do not have battery storage to harness it.

Increased power demands facilitate independent energy.

Businesses with intense spikes in energy incur costly demand charges from their utility can avoid these spikes by storing solar generation. Excess solar energy generated during the day that can't be stored is sent back to the utility through Net Energy Metering, but at a much lower rate than peak demand rates.

Valuable incentives, cost saving technology and short payback periods are common for most projects which provides extra cash to be used to hire critical talent, invest in innovative equipment or store away for a rainy day.


