## **Congrats to our Rising Stars of the Year**

In September 2022 the Carlsbad Chamber launched its fourth annual Rising Star of the Month program to honor local area high school seniors for demonstrating char-

demonstrating character, integrity, love of learning, involvement in school and community activities and the ability to overcome challenging life circumstances without compromising their education. This year we honored 33 high school seniors from seven differ-

ent high schools here in Carlsbad.

The students who are honored each month are selected by the high schools themselves. At the end of the school year, those students who were honored throughout the year as Rising Stars of the Month, are then eligible to apply for the Rising Star of the Year scholarship. This year the Carlsbad Chamber was able to honor ten exceptional students. They were all recognized for making a difference in their home, school and community. Each of the ten Rising Stars of the Year were acknowledged in May with a \$1,500 scholarship. A short description about each student is listed here to introduce them to you.

Ava Grosely (Carlsbad High School) – Ava is Senior Class President of Carlsbad High School. She has overcome a very challenging and abusive upbringing to make a huge impact at Carlsbad High. In the fall she will be attending USC as an English Major with aspirations of possibly being a lawyer.

Carleigh Lyon (Carlsbad High School) – Carleigh is a legally deaf teenager who has refused to let her challenges stop her. Despite her challenges she's a major contributor to Best Buddies at Carlsbad High

Shane Baum (**La Costa Canyon High School**) – Shane was ASB Co-President at La Costa Canyon this year. He used his voice to both help fight gun violence in schools and focus on inclusivity. Next year Shane will attend the University of Michigan and study

Political Science on a Pre-Law track. He hopes to be a Civil Rights Attorney.

Madison Desjardins (La Costa Canyon High School) – Madison spent her senior year as the face of La Costa Canyon as she was the lead anchor for Maverick Nation TV. During her personal time,

she started her own nonprofit called Seeds of Love to help refugee children. Madison will attend Texas Christian University in the fall and majoring in Business Finance & Real Estate.

Drea McIver-Fiorica (La Costa Canyon High School) – During her senior year, Drea served as the President of PALS Club (Peer Assistant Listeners). Their mission is to improve LCC's campus culture through empathy, educa-







## **National Farmers Market Week!**

It's time to get ready for National Farmers Market Week! Now in its 24th year, National Farmers Market Week (August 6-12, 2023) is an annual celebration that highlights the vi-

tal role farmers markets play in our nation's food system. It is also a great opportunity to showcase how much value Carlsbad's downtown farmers market brings to its community.

The State Street Farmers Market has been a staple in downtown Carls-

bad for nearly three decades. Originally called the Carlsbad Farmers Market and located in a parking lot on Roosevelt Street, tucked between a bank, apartments and office buildings, it opened with 20 eager vendors to much public fanfare. It was an immediate success and became part of the fabric of Carlsbad Village. Nineteen years later, in 2013, to help create a more vibrant downtown and enhance its retail offerings, the market was relocated to State Street, between Carlsbad Village Drive and Grand Avenue. It has grown and flourished in its current location over the past 10 years and is now more popular than ever!

Farmers Markets have evolved tremendously since their early days. A push towards certified organic, meaning that farmers and businesses have met strict standards for the growing, processing and handling of their products, and are certified by the USDA, is an achievement not every market shares. The State Street Farmers Market is proud of

its certified organic status and continually looks for ways to keep its market on the cutting edge

As the desire for healthier food options has grown, including vegetarian, gluten free and vegan, and minimally processed foods as well, the appeal of local, outdoor markets has increased. The State Street Farmers Market is proud to feature a wide variety of products including line-caught fish, as well as pasture raised chicken and eggs, and grass fed and finished beef from local, sustainable, family farms. Knowing that sustainable practices, including regenerative grazing are being used and fostered every day, is one of the things that makes farmers markets so beneficial.

What's new in 2023? To help shoppers use farmers market products in their own kitchens, the Carlsbad Village Association (CVA) has joined forces with a local award-winning chef to bring creative and fun cooking demonstrations to the market on the first Wednesday of every month. Using ingredients from the farmers market, watch a chef create a signature dish live, from start to finish, in record time, at the top of the hour (3pm, 4pm, 5pm and 6pm) complete with delicious samples and an ingredient list and recipe to boot! You can enjoy everything from a simple heirloom tomato and balsamic summer bruschetta to pork medallions with a cherry reduction. It is great fun

and yummy too!

Also new this year is a rotational "hot food" guest vendor program. Alongside our regulars who cook up tasty Kenyan, Thai, Indian food and more, we also have visiting vendors offering fresh fish burritos, gourmet grilled cheese sandwiches, Spanish paella, and authentic Filipino food. The variety keeps our customers coming back for more!

And this year CVA is working with the City of Carlsbad on the state's single use plastics initiative, continue our promotion and delivery of reusable bags, and be an educational hub to help inform others.

With over 60 vendors at the State Street Farmers Market, you are certain to find plenty to make you and your family happy. From local, picked-that-day produce and flowers to freshly baked bread, croissants and pastries to creative artisan foods, cheeses, sauces, dips, decadent sweets, and more, the shopping experience is always delightful. And knowing that you are supporting over 60 small businesses and farms as you shop, makes it even more worthwhile and impactful.

## CSUSM's new infinity lab offers incubator to biotech startups

When Thomas Lyle Temple began searching for lab space to house his biotech startup, he wasn't exactly enamored with his

Temple toured facilities private in the region that failed to meet his expectations multiple ways whether the culprit was age, accumulated dust or debris. And for the privilege of occupying such a space, the going rate was \$10,000 a month or more.

What a pleasant

change it was for Temple, then, when his nascent company's head of business development told him about a new opportunity to rent room in Cal State San Marcos' Extended Learning building. The bright and modern lab on the fourth floor marked such a sharp contrast to what he had been seeing that he accepted on the spot.

"It's been wonderful," Temple said. "This lab space is incredibly nice."

Temple is the president and CEO of Grann Pharmaceuticals, a biotech that he formed with several classmates while they were still students at Whittier College. This spring, before they even had graduated, Grann moved into the Infinity Lab, a state-of-theart research facility in the Extended Learning building. In mid-July, Grann was joined in the lab by a second client: Alcheme Bio, a small startup founded by Vanessa Small, a

member of the advisory council for CSUSM's College of Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics.

The Infinity Lab was designed as a teaching space, but partly because of the pandemic, it hasn't been used for that purpose since the building opened four years ago. In 2020, CSUSM initiated an experiment to reimagine the lab by leasing space to cancer diagnostics company Volition, which stayed for about a year before

Now, CSUSM is doubling down on the

growth of its innovation ecosystem. Debora Galasso, a 25-year veteran of the biotech industry and CSUSM lecturer, has been recruited to manage the expansion of the Infinity Lab. She said CSUSM is the only university in San Diego County that is dipping its toe into a venture that is typically the province of for-profit companies.

"Our goal is to demonstrate proof of concept," Galasso said. "The space is sitting idle. Let's see if we can make this work."

The Infinity Lab is a molecular and cellular biology lab that features four benches, a tissue culture room for culturing cells and an impressive collection of the type of equipment any biotech startup would require. Space can be rented by the linear foot. The lab can accommodate three to five companies at a time, and renewable leases are for six-month terms, as befits a lab that considers itself a biotech incubator.

"The idea would be to not have companies in for over two years," Galasso said. "Within two years, you should be growing enough that you need to go somewhere else."

Because of its university affiliation, a requirement of the Infinity Lab is that students benefit from any industry partnership. That can take multiple forms, from students being hired as interns, to companies hosting classes in the lab to tell their story, to biotech entrepreneurs speaking on campus in a casual, roundtable style.

Grann, for example, has brought aboard two CSUSM master's students as interns for the upcoming school year, and the students will learn Grann's process of re-expressing proteins using mRNA lipid nanoparticle

Temple said the directive that Grann involve students in its operations is nothing but a win-win proposition. His company has added interns who might end up being future employees, while CSUSM students can not only tap into Grann's collective brainpower, but also borrow expensive scientific instruments that not even the Infinity Lab possesses.

"Cal State San Marcos has been great," Temple said. "This place couldn't be

# Tri-City Medical Center celebrates 100th watchman procedure for atrial fibrillation

"Last month, we completed the 100th procedure to implant the Watchman FLX™ device into the heart of a 67-year-old patient who has congestive heart failure and takes

warfarin for her atrial fibrillation," said Aaron Yung, MD, FACC, the interventional and structural cardiologist at **Tri-City Medical Center** who performed the procedure. "This is life-changing as it will reduce her risk for stroke and bleeding, as well

as allow her to stop taking a blood thinner forever"

The Watchman implant is for patients with non-valvular atrial fibrillation (AFib), which is a quivering heart rhythm arising from the top chambers, or atria, of the heart. AFib can cause blood to pool in a pouch of the left atrium called the left atrial appendage (LAA) and form clots. This may lead to a stroke.

The device resembles a parachute and comes in five different sizes to fit a person's heart. "During this minimally invasive, one-hour procedure, the collapsed device is deployed to the heart via a catheter inserted into the groin," added Dr. Yung. "Once in place, it self-expands to about the size of a quarter to safely seal off the LAA to prevent blood clots from entering the bloodstream."

Most patients stay overnight and then come back for a follow-up about six weeks

later. During that time, they remain on a blood thinner and low-dose aspirin while a layer of heart tissue begins to grow over the device to secure it in place and form a barrier against blood clots. Based on their doctor's recommendations after closely monitoring the tissue growth for three to six months, patients can then stop taking medications.

"I am so grateful that Tri-City Medical Center offers this procedure and feel that it has given me a new lease on life and peace of mind," said Connie Kindel, the 100th Watchman recipient. "Tri-City is one of the best hospitals I've ever been to and the only one I will come to."

More than 12 million people are expected to have AFib by 2030, according to the American Heart Association. Some do not experience any symptoms and others may feel a fast heartbeat, fatigue, shortness of breath, chest pain or dizziness. Patients diagnosed with AFib usually need to take a blood-thinning medication to prevent blood clots from forming. But these medicines can increase the risk of serious bleeding from injuries or intestinal problems. They require monthly monitoring via a blood test, as well as dietary and lifestyle changes, so they may not be appropriate for everyone.

Clinical trials have shown that the Watchman procedure is a safe and effective solution for patients with non-valvular AFib. More than 300,000 people have received the permanent Watchman implant. 

## Find your element by doing less


We often make the mistake of thinking more is better. When you operate in your element, you do more with less. Less effort, less time, less frustration thus bringing you more joy and impact.

Regardless of your age or the roles you play in your life, people are people, learning is learning, and we all want to do well at what we do. COVID changed people's lives, not only because of new mandates and daily expectations, but because it changed what they wanted out of life. We spend so much time gaining knowledge that we rarely take the time to figure out why we really want it. In addition to information overload, we often suffer from opinion overload. #### Students engage with civics through local and statewide opportunities

At Pacific Ridge School, students develop local and statewide civic relationships through intentional engagement with the Carlsbad community, as well as local and state leaders. This past year the students built meaningful connections through service and outreach, and look to continue that progress this school year.

A diverse group of students served as interns for local leaders, including Carlsbad City Council Members Dr. Priya Bhat-Patel and Teresa Acosta, where they represented a wide range of backgrounds and perspectives. This diversity is important in policymaking, as they could voice the needs and concerns of various student groups, thereby bridging the gap between local youth and their city government.

In the Junior Class Project, high school juniors interview a professional from an area of work they wish to eventually pursue. Here, students connected with local professionals and learned from their work and personal stories, gaining valuable insight regarding the path required to enter that profession, as well as sage life advice along the way. Carlsbad professionals like Chad Adcox, General Manager of Carlsbad by the Sea Hotel, were generous to lend their time to be interviewed by our students and impart their knowledge.

Last January, a group of students traveled to Sacramento to advocate state legislators on increased funding for community colleges like MiraCosta in the upcoming state budget. These student advocates included representatives from a variety of socioeconomic backgrounds, recognizing that community college is often an essential step for those who may not have immediate access to four-year colleges or universities. The students were fortunate to meet with Assem-
