





Cal State San Marcos' second annual Blue & Silver fundraising dinner in June marked another historic night, raising a record-breaking \$1,070,100 for social mobility

and student success initiatives. A one-toone match made possible by philanthropist Daniel J. Epstein and his wife, Phyllis, doubled the impact of every dollar raised during the evening.

The event, co-hosted by President Ellen Neufeldt and the CSUSM Foundation Board,

welcomed nearly 300 alumni, community leaders, campus partners, tribal leaders and elected officials. Jessica Berger, CSUSM's vice president of University Advancement, opened the event as a celebration of Cal State San Marcos, taking a moment to recognize the sponsors and partners who made it possible.

"This evening is truly a celebration of the power of Cal State San Marcos, driven by the individual power of all of you – our strongest friends, advocates and supporters," Berger

Such support extended to the evening's entertainment, with a Steinway & Sons grand piano featured in student performances by Daniel Cruz as well as a quartet from the CSUSM Jazz Ensemble: Troy Amos, Andrew Kelly, Andrew Marin and Michael

Emilie Hersh and Simon Kuo - the Foundation Board's chair and vice chair, respectively - set the tone for the evening with their remarks.

"All of these students are committed to succeeding and bringing about change in the community," Hersh said. "This is one of the many reasons I have been inspired and honored to be part of the CSUSM commu-

CSUSM's mission of social mobility is ded-

icated to creating pathways to success for every student. More than 50% of the university's students are the first in their families to attend college, and many of these students work part-time or full-time jobs to fund their education. By fostering partnerships with local industries, nonprofit organizations and community leaders, CSUSM builds a powerful network of support that propels student

"Over the years, I've heard from numerous students about how their education at CSUSM has transformed their lives and moved them up the economic ladder," Kuo said. "This is a place that helps students overcome barriers and forge a better future."

Neufeldt took to the stage with a compelling speech highlighting CSUSM's transformative impact in higher education.

"Together, we will continue to rise, to thrive, to be that beacon of where the future of higher ed is going," Neufeldt said.

She reaffirmed CSUSM's commitment to expanding access and education for all as a national leader in social mobility.

The Blue & Silver dinner capped a fiscal year in which CSUSM raised the most money in its 35-year history. Boosted by historic gifts by the Epstein family and Price Philanthropies Foundation this spring, the university brought it more than \$26 million in 2023-24.

It's been a banner year for Carlsbad Unified. We're proud to celebrate following achievements and awards across the district:

The California Department of Education (CDE) has recognized CUSD's strong academic

performance, as our students' performance significantly outpaces that of other students across the state.

Supported by new Proposition 28 funds for music and the arts, and by the Carlsbad **Educational Foundation**, we now offer a comprehensive music program and a fulltime music teacher at every CUSD elementary school

"No Place for Hate" -- All Carlsbad Unified schools have earned this designation by building inclusive and safe communities where respect is the goal. Our anti-bullying strategy aims to help everyone in our schools understand bias and combat its effects.

CDE recognized Aviara Oaks Middle School (AOMS) as a 2024 California Distinguished School for closing the achievement gap and demonstrating exceptional student performance. AOMS was also named a Recognized 2024 ASCA Model Program by the American School Counselor Association for delivering an exemplary school counseling program. And Calavera Hills Middle **School** was named a California School to Watch for 2024 by California State Superintendent Tony Thurmond.

With solid community support, our Measure HH construction projects continue to support educational excellence into the future. We broke ground on campus-wide modernization projects at Aviara Oaks Elementary School and Valley Middle School; we are installing STEAM Labs (for

science, technology, engineering, the arts, and math) at eight of our nine elementary schools; and we completed construction projects at **Jefferson Elementary**, including our first Culinary Arts Lab for elementary students. Jefferson has also been recognized by the US Department of Education as a Green Ribbon School for environmental and sustainability education.

As always, it is our people who shine. Peter Manzi, Band Director at Carlsbad High **School**, was named one of five San Diego County Teachers of the Year for 2024-25.

The ASB at Sage Creek High School was honored with the 2024 Outstanding Leadership Program Award from the California Association of Student Leaders for developing student leaders who are ethical, responsible, and servant-minded architects of change.

Sage Creek High School's multimedia journalism program, The Sage, was rated as fifth in the nation for journalism programs through the School Newspapers Online Distinguished Site Program for 2023-24.

Carlsbad High School's broadcasting program, CHSTV, won the 2023 Pacemaker Award for Broadcast News Program, considered the "Pulitzer Prize of Student Journalism," for the fifth year in a row.

The Association of California School Administrators, Region 18, recognized Kasia Obrzut as the 2024 Curriculum and Instruction Administrator of the Year. And the California School Boards Association recognized Anne Garcia as the Executive Assistant of the Year in the San Diego Region.




How to prevent skin cancer

PREVENT MOST COMMON CANCER

Living in sunny places like Southern California means you need to wear sunscreen and take precautions when you're outside. This helps prevent sunburns and reduces the risk of getting skin cancer.



"Being aware of the risks of sun exposure and the many things you can do to protect your skin are important skin cancer preventive steps," says Hubert Greenway, Jr., MD, a dermatologist and head of Bighorn Mohs Surgery and Dermatology Center at Scripps Clinic Torrey Pines and

head of the Cutaneous Section at Scripps Cancer Center.

Recognizing early signs of skin cancer is crucial. Early detection is important for effective treatment.

WHO GETS SKIN CANCER?

Skin cancer is the most common type of cancer in the United States. One in five Americans will develop skin cancer in their

Anyone can get skin cancer, but some are at higher risk, including people with fair skin or a family history of skin cancer. Dr. Greenway recommends people at risk for skin cancer get regular skin checks with a dermatologist.

Skin cancer has a high survival rate if caught early.

WHAT ARE THE TYPES OF SKIN

There are three main types of skin cancer: basal cell carcinoma, squamous cell carcinoma and melanoma.

Melanoma is the most serious type because it can spread to other parts of the body. Even though melanoma is rare, it causes skin cancer deaths. Melanoma is also common in people under 30, especially women. Squamous Cell Carcinoma can also spread, most commonly to lymph nodes.

THE SUN FACTOR

Living in sunny areas all year can be nice, but it's important to protect your skin from too much sun exposure. Overexposure to the sun plays a role in all three skin cancer

While a severe sunburn will heal on the surface in a few days, the real damage may not emerge until decades later.



Being aware of the risks of sun exposure and the many things you can do to protect your skin are important skin cancer preventive steps.

"Cumulative sun exposure is a major skin cancer risk factor for developing nonmelanoma skin cancer," Dr. Greenway explains. "Episodes of acute sunburn are often linked to melanoma."

FIVE WAYS TO PREVENT SKIN CANCER

1. Avoid too much sun

Spending a lot of time outside without sunscreen or protective clothing for work or fun can raise your risk of skin cancer. The sun's UV rays are the primary cause of skin

"Everyone needs to protect their skin from sun damage," says Dr. Greenway. "In Southern California, where the sun's rays burn stronger than in milder climates, using broad spectrum sunscreen with at least 30 SPF should be a daily ritual."

Skin can be harmed by the sun's UV rays in just 15 minutes if not protected. Even on cool and cloudy days, you still need sun protection since UV rays, not temperature, do the damage. Reflected rays from water, sand or snow can also increase your risk of

Dr. Greenway recommends avoiding the sun between 10 am and 2 pm, when it's strongest. Plan outdoor activities like tennis, golf, or surfing for the morning or evening

2. Avoid tanning beds

Avoid tanning beds and sunlamps as they also emit UV rays.

"Exposure to damaging rays should be avoided whether they are natural or artificial. Tanning beds raise the risk of melanoma. They also dry the skin, causing wrinkles and premature aging," Dr. Greenway says.

3. Bring sun protection

Skin cancer awareness is about knowing that you can prevent it. Experts recommend keeping sun protection items in a bag to use when you go outside to avoid getting a sunburn.

Make sure to include:

- A lightweight long-sleeved shirt or other protective clothing
- A hat with a wide brim that shades your face, head, ears and neck
- · Sunglasses to protect your eyes and surrounding skin (Dr. Greenway notes he has a sister who had melanoma of her eye requiring removal of the eye)
- · Sunscreen with at least 30 sun protection factor (SPF) and broad-spectrum protection

4. Check your skin

While genetics is a risk factor, the fact is anyone who ever had a sunburn is at risk for skin cancer and should practice self-vigilance.

Moles that can become cancerous are often found on the head, neck, upper back, torso, or lower legs. They can also appear in other areas of the body.

Moles should be self-checked monthly. Mirrors and digital photographs can be useful to observe and track them. If a mole

becomes darker, develops ragged borders or appears to be changing, see a dermatologist.

"Regardless of their family history or personal risk, people should watch for atypical moles, which tend to be multicolored and asymmetrical," Dr. Greenway says.

An itchy mole can also indicate problems. If a mole just seems more obvious, it's a good idea to get it checked by a derma-

"Always remember that the most effective way to beat melanoma and other skin cancers is prevention," Dr. Greenway says. "Otherwise, early detection is the best bet. Monthly self-exams and annual checkups can be lifesavers."

5. Schedule skin cancer screenings

The Cutaneous Section of the Scripps Cancer Center recommends people at high risk of skin cancer see a dermatologist at least once a year for a full-body skin check. The American Cancer Society does not have specific screening guidelines for skin cancer. However, it recommends checking your skin often for any changes to stay aware.

Finding melanoma, the deadliest skin cancer, early is crucial as it spreads fast if not caught "In its earliest stages, melanoma can be removed surgically," says Dr. Greenway.

"Mohs surgery is a precise surgical technique used for treating melanoma and other skin cancers. During this procedure, layers of cancer-containing skin are progressively removed and examined until only cancer-free tissue remains," he says.

If melanoma has spread, other therapies may be required including immunotherapy which offers significant advantages in melanoma and other cancers.

The Halls Are Alive with the Sound of Music

Carlsbad Unified School District (CUSD) celebrates a milestone in its music education program. With additional state funding and a \$430,000 grant from **Carlsbad Educational** Foundation (CEF), every elementary school is staffed with a full-time music teacher providing weekly classes to students in grades

"The full-time music teachers have become part of our team and truly invest in the goals that we have set forth for our school site," said Calavera Hills Elementary (CHE) Principal Kimberly Fuentes.

In a 2023-24 staff meeting, Ms. Fuentes noted improvements in attendance, and math and reading scores in the Standardized Testing and Reporting (STAR) program after CHE introduced a full-time music teacher.

"Students want to be here," Fuentes said. "Students feel like they belong to something." Before the funding from California's Proposition 28 and the grant from CEF, CUSD had not funded full-time music teachers at each of its nine elementary schools in over 20 years.

California voters passed Prop. 28 in 2022, providing an additional 1% of a school's annual budget to art and music programs. However, Carlsbad Unified School District remains one of the lowest funded K-12 districts in San Diego County, receiving less per pupil funding than its neighboring unified districts.

Carlsbad Educational Foundation helps bridge the funding gap. Thanks to donations from individuals and community partners, CEF awarded more than \$1.5 million in grants for TK-12 programs in music, STEAM, and innovation for the 2024-25 school year.

"The funding from CEF gives teachers the opportunities to keep programs thriving," said CHE Music Teacher Kelly Lack. "The

things I hear from teachers, staff, and parents, is that music in Carlsbad this year has brought families back to school."

The elementary music program is one of 40 programs benefiting students at every grade level in CUSD.

"We are immensely grateful to the Carlsbad Educational Foundation, and its community of supporters, for its unwavering support of exemplary programs benefiting the students of Carlsbad Unified School District," said CUSD Superintendent Ben Churchill.




