All in the "Chamber" family

My favorite way to describe the Carlsbad Chamber of Commerce is to refer to us as a "family". We love our members,

our Board, our committees, our volunteers and our staff members. One big happy family. And as it turns out, "family" has been part of the DNA of the Carlsbad Chamber throughout its history.

The Chamber was founded and initially led by Roy G. Chase in 1923. He served as Chamber President at the founding and then again in 1928. Roy was a multi-talented community-minded individual. He served as postmaster, ran the railroad station, opened a small grocery store and housed the Carlsbad Chamber of Commerce, all in the old Carlsbad train depot. He was also a developer. He built the Los Diego Hotel, the sanctuary of the Carlsbad Union Church and Carlsbad's first theater. Roy's wife was also very involved in the community, especially as a charter member of the Carlsbad Women's Club, the public library and in their general store.

Roy Chase's family connection to the Chamber extended when his daughter, Dee Chase married Dewey McClellan. Dewey was a real estate agent here in Carlsbad. Dewey became Chamber Board President in 1932 and again in 1946. Dewey's role in Carlsbad was am-

plified in 1952 when Carlsbad finally incorporated and became its own official city. At that time, Dewey became the first Mayor of the City of Carlsbad.

Dewey McClellan clearly instilled the value of the Carlsbad Chamber of Commerce to his family as his son Gerald served as Chamber Board President in 1953 and 1954. So when Gerald's son Jayce McClellan stepped up to serve as Board President in 1972, that marked four generations that spanned the first 50 years of the Carlsbad Chamber's history. Quite a family legacy Roy created.

The McClellan name is also famous in Carlsbad for the **McClellan-Palomar Airport**. It was Dewey McClellan's son, Jerry, who negotiated to sell some of the family's land to the County of San Diego to create the airport. That was back in the early 1950's. The airport opened in March, 1959 in what was originally unincorporated Carlsbad. At that time, the "city" of Carlsbad was only 7.5 square miles. Today the city is nearly 40 square miles and wraps around the airport on all sides.

Family legacy on the Carlsbad Chamber Board is not limited to the Chase-McClellan family. Aaron Byzak, the Chief External Affairs Officer at **Tri-City Medical Center**,


is currently a member of the Carlsbad Chamber of Commerce's Board of Directors. He has served on our Board for the past six years. Aaron's grandfather, Wilfred H. "Chick" Mensching, served on the Carlsbad Chamber Board in the 1970's. Chick was a banker here in Carlsbad. He worked in executive roles in 5 different banks in Carlsbad, as well as some other banks in the Tri-City area. He set a strong leadership example as he served on many civic organizations and nonprofit boards. Chick was the founding President of the Hi-Noon Rotary Club of Carlsbad and received the Carlsbad Citizen of the Year award in 1981. Chick was the first non-citizen to be awarded the Citizen of the Year honor. Aaron has followed his grandfather's lead by serving on countless nonprofit boards. Among the many organizations he serves, he sits on the Board of Directors for the Carlsbad and Vista Chambers of Commerce, as well as serving as the current Board Chair for the San Diego North Economic **Development Council**.

MiraCosta's grants will focus on enhancing career pathways in biotechnology and biomanufacturing through experiential learning and mentorship.

This grant of \$649,986 is allocated for a project that aims to remove the fear of science and offer hands-on, industry-relevant skills to students. The BioSCOPE (Bioscience Supply Chain Operations Projects for Education) model will enable students to produce laboratory reagents and consumables that meet industry quality standards. These products will be distributed to high schools

as components of laboratory kits, encouraging seamless transitions for students from high school to community college bioscience programs.

The project is a collaborative effort between the Bioscience Workforce Development Hub at MiraCosta College, the Bay Area Bioscience Education Community (BA-BEC), and Laney College.

Empowering STEM Cohorts for Biomanufacturing Careers

The \$1 million grant aims to create robust pathways for students in emerging biomanufacturing technologies. The project offers internship, pre-apprenticeship, and apprenticeship experiences in biomanufacturing, targeting underrepresented groups in STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics).

This groundbreaking initiative will enhance the employability of MiraCosta students and address the need for an inclusive. diverse, and skilled workforce in the industry. The project is in alignment with the NSF ExLENT Program.

Mike Fino, the Dean of Math and Sciences at MiraCosta College, stated, "These NSF grants are a significant milestone, not just for MiraCosta College, but for the future of biotechnology and biomanufacturing education in California. They will provide invaluable opportunities for our students to engage in real-world applications of science and technology, thereby opening doors to fulfilling, high-wage careers in sectors that are crucial for our society's well-being."

Both grants focus on enhancing career pathways in biotechnology and biomanufacturing through experiential learning and mentorship. Measurable outcomes include the impact of mentorship and internships on retention, completion, and employment rates for diverse student populations.

Also, in August, students from the SCHS Biomedical Science pathway attended the Society of Neurointerventional Surgery's Annual Symposium in San Diego. There they shadowed neuroscientists and learned about the latest advances in the field.

High school students, such as those in teacher Katie Maglia's English classes at Carlsbad Village Academy, expanded their career-readiness knowledge through the Student Opportunities for Career Awareness and Learning (SOCAL) website.

This resource, developed in partnership with Tri City Medical Center and the Chambers of Commerce of Carlsbad, Vista, and Oceanside, informs students about local job opportunities in high-demand, high-wage industry sectors. Carlsbad Chamber of Commerce CEO Bret Schanzenbach and Carlsbad Unified Career Education Specialist Nicole Moersch were on hand to capture the lessons on a video that then was featured at the Carlsbad Chamber's Centennial Gala on October 13th.

Internships and experiences such as these help equip high school students with the tools they need to make informed decisions about their career paths.



How do I know I can trust you to win?


he's panting, eyes swollen, he's going down for good, then...you know what happens. He grits his teeth, fires his fists, and he's victorious! All together now, "AAADRIAANNN!".

You never doubted it, right? You've seen the movie

a thousand times, and the ending never changes. What if you could be assured of that same victory as an investor—that you will always win even when the market lands blow after blow upon you, as it is right now? What if I told you that it's no more difficult than memorizing a few numbers, applying them to your portfolio, and then developing the internal strength to never lose faith like Rocky?

12. 10. 6. 3. I said these numbers would be important back in July. I also said many are standing on a financial cliff edge, which I'm now changing to standing on the shore at South Ponto—my family's favorite beach. I also introduced the concept of 'margin of safety'—that if an impending tsunami were approaching Ponto, you would run away from the beach to increase your margin of safety.

Imagine the tsunami representing the ever-rising price of the things you need to buy for the rest of your life. Now, picture the

distance you create between you and the tsunami representing your ability to afford those goods and services. If you make it up into the hills of San Elijo, the tsunami isn't a threat. If you only make it to the Ponto parkina lot, well, we're still looking for you.

Those numbers represent the following: 12% is the long-term average annual return of owning small-capitalized businesses (Russell 2000); 10% is that for large-capitalized businesses (S&P 500); 6% is that for lending money to these businesses (Barclay's Agg.); and 3% is that for lending money to your bank (checking/savings account).

Let's subtract 3% (the annual average increase in your cost of living) from each to find out your real rate of return, or your distance from the tsunami. You now have: 9%/ yr small, 7%/yr large, 3%/yr bond, and 0% cash long-term. Cash at 0% equals the Ponto parking lot—the death of your purchasing power long-term. Any combo of the 9, 7, and 3, represents some measure of distance or safety from the tsunami.

Did vou know that investors like vou across the country are holding the largest


amounts of cash on the sidelines in history? What does this suggest to you from the facts above? If you think I'm insinuating that your definition of risk as it relates to purchasing power might be backwards, i.e. cash is safe, you're right! If you think I'm suggesting that to stay ahead of the rising cost of the rest of your life, then you need to own the things that have always historically kept you ahead, you're right!

Yet I get it, if you were born before 1973, near the time of Rocky I, you're beat up as we've already lived through three episodes in which the broad U.S. stock market (S&P500) went down by roughly half. Apollo Creed nailed you for a -48% in '73-'74 BAM! Clubber Lang for a -49% in '00-'02 BAM! BAM! And Ivan Drago for a whopping -57% in '07-'09 BAM! BAM! BAM! Oh, plus that -34% in 33 days in 2020! That's like a sucker-punch.

Yet, you must pull through and invest for the sake of your Ideal Life and those you love and care most about in the world. The historical record is all we've got, and it's been 100% correct so far. Talk to your advisor and make sure your portfolio is exactly where it needs to be, not where you want it to be. Rocky's tough-loving coach and mentor, Mickey Goldmill, says it best, "You see, fear is a fighter's investor's best friend. You know, but it ain't nothing to be scared of. You gotta learn to use it!"





RCBA is a relationship between the Carlsbad Chamber of Commerce, local businesses and the City of Carlsbad.

The RCBA has hosted over 25 symposiums and workshops over the past 13 years. Those symposiums and workshops cover topics such as wildfire risks, first aid basics, active shooter drills, cybersecurity best practices, and much more
